



County Durham lies between the River Wear and River Tees and is varied and beautiful.

Our National Garden Scheme open gardens can be found in the city, high up in the Dales and in the attractive villages of South Durham. Something different every week.

We are delighted that our favourite gardens are open again this year and are also very pleased to welcome new openers. Do visit and encourage friends to see the Secret Gardens of Langholm Crescent, a very interesting and creative collection of gardens alongside a larger garden at the Cottage. Willowburn Hospice has joined us this year and are keen to share their developing garden, lovingly looked after by volunteers. All the gardeners are looking forward to welcoming you and having your support and encouragement in their enterprises.

Northumberland is a county of ancient castles and wild coastline, of expansive views and big skies.

Northumberland is a rich and varied landscape of wild uplands where moorland birds nest, picturesque valleys and a coastline of castles and fishing villages. It's the perfect backdrop for historic as well as exciting contemporary gardens.

Some have been created over generations. A manor house garden associated with Gertrude Jekyll, a 19th century mansion set in 10 acres of walled gardens, a 14th century pele tower and Jacobean house with fabulous views over the Tyne Valley. Others have been made over a number of years by their owners and are packed full of ideas. A town garden on a dramatically steep site, a country cottage filled with roses and lavender, an artist's garden by the sea.

Then there's newly designed gardens, one of which won an award from the Society of Garden Designers, another redesigned with a gravel garden and stone rill. Within the remains of an old walled garden, featuring extensive perennial planting around a central rill and reflective pool. Also potager kitchen garden, wildflower meadow and herbaceous border. Designed by Matthew Wilson (attending on the day) and awarded Best Large Landscape and Garden 2022 Society of Garden Designers Awards. No chemicals and wildlife friendly. 



The garden, landscaped grounds and woods cover around 15 acres. The wooded approach opens out to lawn areas surrounded by ornamental and woodland shrubs and trees. A courtyard garden leads to an ornamental walled garden, beyond which is an orchard, fruit and flower garden and rose arbour. To the south the garden looks out over a lake and field walks, with woodland walks to the west. Most areas are accessible though sometimes by circuitous routes or an occasional step. In sight of Dunstanburgh Castle, in the picturesque village of Craster, sit 3 very different cottage gardens showing what can be achieved in a windy seaside setting. Formerly allotments attached to fishermen's cottages - No.1 is newly developed, has two ponds, colour-themed borders and prairie style planting. No. 2 has sea views, many perennial bee friendly plants, roses galore and a lovely herbaceous border. No. 5 is a ½4 acre, divided into several separate areas: woodland garden, pond, fruit and vegetables plus borders featuring many unusual perennials, shrubs, grasses and ferns. The garden is managed to encourage wildlife. There is a pub and 2 cafes in the village and picnic benches and ice cream vendor in the harbour area.

From the A1 turn R onto the B6347 signed Christon Bank & Seahouses. Turn into the Fallodon gates after exactly 2m, at Xrds. Follow drive for 1m. Sat 24 June (2-5). Adm £6, chd free. Home-made teas. Refreshments in aid of local churches and the village school. Visits also by arrangement for groups of 5+. Extensive, well established garden, with a hot greenhouse beside the bog garden. The late C17 walls of the kitchen garden surround cutting and vegetable borders and the fruit greenhouse. Natasha McEwen replanted the sunken garden from 1898 and the redesigned 30 metres border was planted in 2019. Woodlands, pond and arboretum with over 10 acres to explore. Grave of Sir Edward Grey, Foreign Secretary during WW1, famous ornithologist and fly fisherman, is in the woods near the pond and arboretum. The walls of the kitchen garden contain a fireplace built to heat the fruit trees of the Salkeld family, renowned for their gardening expertise in the C17. Partial wheelchair access.



Cream teas. Light lunches from 12pm. The terraced garden has stunning views over the Tyne Valley. Massive beech hedges give protection for herbaceous borders, lawns and shrubs. A box parterre is filled with fruit, vegetables and picking flowers. Paths lead through a recently created wildflower meadow garden. The Castle (not open) is a C14 Pele tower with Jacobean manor house attached beside a charming chapel with Norman origins. Partial wheelchair access.





III HEATHER HOLM

Stanghow Road, Stanghow, Saltburn-By-The-Sea, TS12 3JU. Arthur & June Murray. Stanghow is 5 km E of Guisborough on A171. Turn L at Lockwood Beck (signed Stanghow) Heather Holm is on the R past the Xrds. Sun 6 Aug (11-4). Adm £4, chd free. Home-made teas.

Divided into several rooms, this is a garden of different aspects, formal, floral and architectural. The owners have a philosophy of colour throughout the year having many different species of lilies flowering from March to October. Sheltered by mature hedges, hostas and hydrangeas thrive. There are fruit trees, soft fruit bushes, a greenhouse, summerhouse and a large pond attracting wildlife. Regret no dogs.

Five very different and interesting gardens, well named as 'Hidden Gardens' as they are not visible from the road. Oxney Cottage is a very pretty cottage garden with lawns, herbaceous borders and roses, colourful and varied unusual plants. Nags Head Farm has a wonderful rill running alongside a sloping garden with a variety of plants leading to a quiet, peaceful courtyard. There is a large vegetable garden in which stands a magnificent glasshouse with prolific vines. A woodland walk leads to a polytunnel, view point and wildflower meadow. Orchard Gardens is a large interesting garden of mixed planting, stump sculptures, colourful themed beds, fruit trees and different imaginative ornaments. Oxney Flatts has well-stocked herbaceous borders and a wildlife pond. New Cottage garden has mixed herbaceous flower beds, a fruit and vegetable garden and a newly created wildlife pond. Aycliffe Bee Keepers Association will have a stall in the garden of Nags Head Farm. There will be information about bees and bee keeping plus a small display hive where you can safely view bees in action. Honey will be on sale, subject to availability, and 10% of proceeds will be donated to NGS. Partial wheelchair access, grassy and mostly flat. Some areas of gravel. Dogs on a lead welcome in some gardens but not all.



III HIGH BANK FARM

Cleasby Road, Stapleton, Darlington, DL2 2QE. Lesley Thompson. Located on rd leading to Cleasby & Manfield from the Stapleton rd. Drive 300 yds, look out for a sign saying 'Nursery on a Farm', take turning & park in the car park. Sun 25 June (1-4). Combined adm with Holmelands £5, chd free. Home-made teas. The front garden has an abundance of roses, leading onto the orchard. The back garden has a lovely cottage garden, with a secluded summerhouse to relax in, together with paved area with beautiful pots where you can sit and listen to the trickling water from our lovely fishpond. After the Etherley sign continue along the road for approx ¼m, the Cottage is down the track on the L near the 2nd footpath sign. Sun 4 June (1-5). Adm £5, chd free. Light refreshments. Visits also by arrangement 4 Feb to 31 Oct.

In this half acre mature cottage garden grass paths lead you past a wide variety of beds with shrubs, grasses, perennials and trees (native and exotic inc a Wollemi Pine and a Ginko) to a wild area with a small pond and greenhouse with a collection of cacti and succulents. At the top is a larger pond with frogs, toad and newts, patios, vegetable beds, fruit trees and roses. Planting for wildlife. A variety of sculptures and lots of places to sit and admire the garden.
